


ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF COUNTRY

The spiritual life is like that. At the heart of human desire is not speed but a search for breadth, truth, beauty and meaning, a gift that is nurtured in the enterprise of a lifetime. Taking pause and making space

to formulate an insight and to know the depth of our loves is the grace that prayer sustains. In prayer we are close to the essence of human existence. It is all about relationships and ongoing conversion. But it requires reflection, gentleness and patience.

So, what is prayer?

Put simply, it is the inward journey into the mystery at the heart of the universe. And no two journeys are the same. But there are trajectories that point in the direction of growth and the expanding of our personal and communal horizons.

A critical prayer path is that of gratitude. And there is so much give thanks for; for breath that gives life and the mercies we have known, for family and security, for opportunities and successes, for lives of deliberate service and witness, and for gifts we have shared in the Spirit. In this way Christian prayer is eucharistic and sacramental.

Also, prayer collects up the energy of the eons in a merciful embrace of those suffering humanly, and the ache of our hurting planet. In prayer we are joined to pain and fear in all its forms. We lament and we grieve. The joy of the good news is that the damaged and the anxious are not without hope. In Christian prayer resurrection follows the cross.

Seeking forgiveness is another essential prayer focus, for what have I done and for what have I failed to do. Prayer brings judgement on the hurt or damage caused by personal and social selfishness or neglect. Prayer accuses my and our greed and injustice as outside of gospel compassion. Forgiving others is its measuring stick. Prayer refines and redefines and heals and brings peace. Ongoing conversion is the Christian way of prayer.

So, slow down, take a Godly moment often and use this book as a focus if you need one. Open your heart, climb a mountain, play in the surf, sing a hymn, walk in the forest, pause in a chapel, and breathe in deeply the Spirit that gives life. Then you will know what it is to live by the light of Christ.

to be filled with awe and contemplation,



THE CHURCH YEAR




In the Roman Catholic tradition all time is sacred and each year is a journey of faith and prayer. We are invited to stop, to reflect, to celebrate the life of God that calls us into a hopeful future.

Five Finger Prayer of Pope Francis

Using the fingers on your hand, start with the thumb and pray these intentions in this order:

- 1. The thumb is closest finger to you. So start praying for those who are closest to you. They are the persons easiest to remember.
- 2. The next finger is the index or pointer. Pray for those who teach you, instruct you and heal you. They need the support and wisdom to show direction to others. Always keep them in your prayers.
- The following finger is the tallest. It reminds us of our leaders, the governors and those who have authority. They need God's guidance.
- 4. The fourth finger is the ring finger. Even though it may surprise you, it is our weakest finger. It should remind us to pray for the weakest, the sick or those plagued by problems and social injustice. They need your prayers.
- 5. And finally we have our smallest finger, the smallest of all. Your pinkie should remind you to pray for yourself. When you are done praying for the other four groups, you will be able to see your own needs but in the proper perspective, and also you will be able to pray for your own needs in a better way.

God,


Your presence refreshes us like the swooping wind, that clears all the leaves and dust.
